Busy day in Dubbo for ASM's new CEO

In July, the ASM Board appointed Rowena Smith as Chief Executive Officer, after the former Managing Director stepped down.

Long-time followers of the Dubbo Project may recognise Rowena, as she was previously ASM's Chief Operating Officer, leading the Dubbo Project team and overseeing construction and commissioning of the Korean Metals Plant.

Rowena was in Dubbo at the time of her appointment, and was delighted to spend her second day as CEO out and about amongst the community.

The day started early, with a breakfast meeting with the Dubbo Regional Council, where Rowena provided an update on the Dubbo Project.

It was then off to ASM's Toongi site, for the official launch of the Macquarie Agricultural Pathways (MAP) program. Rowena met with representatives from Macquarie Anglican Grammar School and was introduced to the first cohort of students taking part in the programme.

Modification Report (MOD1) update

ASM has lodged a Response to Submissions with the NSW Department of Planning and Environment, following closure of the MOD1 public exhibition period.



Six public submissions were received by the NSW Department of Planning and Environment, and nine submissions from government agencies.

We are now waiting on determination from the department, which is expected toward the end of the year.

The MOD1 reflected several Dubbo Project design improvements resulting from the [Optimisation Study](#) completed in December 2021.

First sale and delivery of NdPr metal from Korean Metals Plant

In exciting news for September, ASM secured its first sale of neodymium praseodymium (NdPr) metal from the Korean Metals Plant.

ASM subsidiary, KSM Metals signed a binding agreement with Korean company NS World for the sale and delivery of up to 10 tonnes of NdPr ingots from September to December 2022.
