Our Commitment

- Australian Strategic Materials (ASM) commits to respecting the human rights of all people.

 and Rights at Work, which includes the elimination of all forms of forced or compulsory labour and
 child labour.
- Conduct due diligence and risk assessments as appropriate, and report in accordance with applicable Modern Slavery laws.
- Comply with the ASM Code of Conduct and Integrity.
- Support and encourage people to Speak Up and report complaints or concerns in a safe way. (ASM Speak Up Policy available on the ASM website (asm-au.com))
- Track the effectiveness of this Policy, continually improve our approach and report on progress.
